

Able Orchestra (AO)

Able Orchestra (AO) is an inclusive music and digital art project, which supports young people from Nottinghamshire aged 11-25 to develop skills and confidence in making and performing music and digital art through inclusive and accessible approaches.

AO has a tiered approach developed, with engagement opportunities for young people at different stages of their musical development. This includes:

- Discover -Taster and school sessions
- Explore Weekly AO ensembles and AO at TOL (The Old Library)
- Excel AO Pioneers (Young Leaders)





AO Pioneers

Able Orchestra (AO) Pioneers are a group of young leaders.

The 2024-2026 AO Pioneers are mentored by Kris and Nicci Halpin of Dyskinetic.

The group consists of young independent musicians who also come together as a band for collective collaborations.

Each Pioneer is developing their own music pathway and have developed skills and confidence in:

- Leadership and decision making
- Co-leading music sessions for other young people
- Developing, creating and performing their own music
- Advocacy and promotion work
- High quality collective collaborations with other artists/musicians.

Case Studies: Jess Fisher

Jess Fisher is a dynamic and innovative musician with a passion for creating digital music. Her journey began with the Able Orchestra, where she first explored her musical talents. From there, Jess embarked on a solo career, crafting unique sounds using CMPSR, an instrument developed by <u>Digit Music</u>.

Cryoflame

CryoFlame is a passionate musician dedicated to creating music that leaves a lasting impact. As a disabled artist, his journey is driven not by fame or fortune but by a deep love for music and a desire to prove what's possible. Through his work, CryoFlame aims to inspire others, sharing their passion and making their mark on the world — one song at a time.

Singer-Songwriter Opportunities

Singer-Songwriter sessions are delivered in Secondary schools during term time.

The Singer-Songwriter Academy (SSA) is hosted at The Old Library for young people aged 11-18 wanting to develop their singer songwriter skills.

Delivered by experienced, professional artists, young people are supported to develop:

- Original songs in genres led by the Young People
- Recordings
- Performance opportunities


eNGine Room Label

Designed to support emerging young artists in their first steps toward releasing music, eNGine Room Label provides support and direction to develop plans tailored to individuals. Working with industry professionals, young people are supported to:

- Develop creative direction and record original tracks
- Work with professional music producers to record, mix and master
- Release new tracks on music distribution sites
- Develop specialist music release marketing campaigns to increase reach
- Rehearse and take up performance opportunities
- Launch the tracks at the eNGine Room Label Showcase in partnership with BBC Introducing

eNGine Room Music Industry Days connect industry professionals with young Nottinghamshire based artists.

Case Study - DRING

DRING (Chloe Dring) is a rising artist first discovered at a performance and then invited to join the Singer-Songwriter Academy (SSA).


- Mentored by artists Matt Blick and Nina Smith, she has developed her craft for the past year.
- Performed at IYA Music Industry Day, Inspire Christmas Concert, Hockley Hustle Festival, Beat the Streets and Catapult Dance Festival.
- DRING is now recording her debut EP with acclaimed Producer Ash Jezhurst, whose credits include Gabrielle Aplin, Tom Walker, Little Mix, Maisie Peters, and Leona Lewis
- DRING has secured a record deal with Lionbear, a label founded by former Managing Director of A&R at EMI.
- Under management of Nina Smith.

This is a huge step forward for DRING and a testament to her growth and dedication over the past year.


